- **Schedule** Each program has different start/end dates and times. Before completing the interest form, ensure that your program(s) of interest fit with your student's summer availability.
- Attendance Students are expected to attend their programs with fidelity. More than
 two absences during the course of the program may cause your student to be
 dropped from the program OR may cause the program as a whole to be canceled.
 Additionally, repeated early dismissals may result in your student being dropped from
 the program.
- **Student Voice** Before completing the interest form, review the course catalog with your student and discuss which programs they are interested in.
- Capacity Each program will have a student capacity of 15-20 students with the exception of Urban Initiatives. Students interested in these programs will be selected at random.
- Interest Forms Complete the OST interest form. Prior to enrolling your student into any programs please be mindful of our attendance policy throughout the entirety of our program.

The deadline to submit the interest form is Monday, May 22nd at 5:00pm.

The form will reopen on Wednesday, May 24th as a waitlist.

• **Confirmation Emails** - Confirmation emails for programs will be sent out on Friday, May 26th. Due to capacity limits, we can not guarantee every student a seat that submits the interest form. If you added your students to the waitlist, confirmation emails will be sent out if/when space becomes available in your program(s) of interest.

Summer Sports Camp emphasized team sports & activities, health education, social emotional learning development, and lots of active play!


